CITIZENSHIP AMENDMENT ACT 2019: ITS REPERCUSSIONS

Recently we witnessed a spontaneous uprising of the indigenous people of North East India against the passing of the Citizentship Amendment Bill in the two houses of Parliament and making it an Act through President's assent. In a record short time, the Head of the Indian Republic signed the bill, making it an obligatory act.

The entire North East India had been hoping that the bill seeking to grant citizenship to presumably and correctly to Hindu majority who flee the neighbouring states on account of religious intolerance and persecution, would once again be put on hold, as it was done last year. The people of the North East had hoped that the security of the region would be taken into consideration and studied in greater detail. But it was not to be so. No doubt, the ruling party, having surprisingly obtained the majority of the seats in the Lok Sabha in the last general elections was confident to pass it anyway, despite erudite counter arguments in the Lok Sabha.

For our indigenous and vulnerable people especially in the rural areas, the original inhabitants losing the majority status and are being reduced to a minority has all along been a genuine reality and over these years, they seemed to have become more conscious but had to watch the demographic changes as mute and hapless spectators.

During these troubled moments, the Provincial House community was able to respond positively in a small way to the crisis of people, mainly Fathers, Brothers and Sisters who were stranded either in the railway station or in the airport, by giving accommodation and other helps. As we pray for the on-going peaceful protests and agitations that they might lead to secure and peaceful solution to the burning issue of the people, we could also do our mite, whenever possible to create an awareness among our people especially in the villages about doing everything possible not to lose the land which God the Father has given to us as our Promised Land, truly flowing with milk and honey. As Fr Sylvanus Sngi (of happy memory) used to say, "Once you lose the land, you become a refugee".

COME THE NEW YEAR, COME THE NEW SCHOLASTIC YEAR AIM FOR HOLISTIC AND EMPOWERING EDUCATION

As the New Year dawns and advances gradually, soon all of us will move into the world of education. We the Salesians are evangelizers and catechisers of the young and one of the ways by which we do it is through our quality education. Quality education and through it empowering and igniting the young minds for positive living and contribution to the society is the real need of the hour.



In my last circular of December, I had exhorted you all especially the Principals who are directly in the field of education, to make a good use of the winter holidays to plan in as much detail as possible on how to achieve a quality and holistic education in this one year. As we know, planning is important and greater the clarity of the planning, the better it is for us. It is good to give it a thought concerning what kind of schedule of study, teaching and learning that we must give which will make our education effective in drawing out the innate intelligence, develop hard work and character, become responsible and keep changing in discipline and behaviour.

Without being negative, while appreciating all the good that is being done, I would say that today most of our schools are really struggling for quality in all senses. Unlike in former times, when we had almost the monopoly in education in many places, today we struggle to reach the standard and the quality that some private institutions, after learning from us, are achieving. Without analyzing too much, I would earnestly request that those who are in the helm of affairs work relentlessly, fearlessly, with greater focus and commitment to ensure rise in standards and quality. It looks to me that in general, the quality of our infrastructures have not been able to obtain quality results and performance.

Right at the start, it is important to plan for the refresher courses of the teachers. The teachers who have stopped learning are the most dangerous teachers. We need to encourage them and give them the opportunity to avail themselves refresher courses. We also need to follow up the teachers in their discipline, punctuality, teaching in the classrooms, performance of duties, their follow up of the students, giving and correcting of home works, class works, etc. These are some of the small actions that we do in order to get big results. Such a follow up needs courage on the part of the Principal.

In the schools, junior colleges and colleges, it will be important to see the number of class days in the school. In quite many of the schools, there is a breakage of classes due to SSLC examinations and so our students lose their precious class days. It looks at times that this is a necessary evil. Hence it is very important for the community particularly the Principal to know whether or not we are giving adequate classroom teaching and learning hours to the students. In this context, it is important to look at the co-curricular activities that we organize in the school. Though the co-curricular activities are important for the holistic growth of children, it is important to see that they do not take away too much of teaching and learning time, even though they promote good participation, promote discipline and learning.

I attended one Annual cum Parents day in one of our schools this year. The Principal sat with me throughout the programme. There was a large participation of students. The costumes were excellent, the Principal told me that he ordered them from Kolkata and the students performed to a very high degree of perfection. There were teachers with the

students all along. Most importantly, what I wish to communicate here is that every item was on a theme, that is very relevant for today's world. Most of the music seemed to be customised. Definitely, the parents who gathered in huge numbers were overjoyed and one of the parents did, on behalf of all, appreciate the school and the Management. I invite everyone to think of such kind of programmes more and more.

During the time of admission, it will be good to keep in mind our commitment to the poorest of the poor. Our greatest success will be to recruit students from the lower strata of the society and over the years, through our preventive system and effective accompaniment of the teachers, parents and students, make them excel in life. We should not forget about our commitment to our own Catholics too. At times we come across that they may approach us late and that they may be low in motivation, but we are meant for them in a greater measure and we cannot run away from them.

Calling for the parents meeting throughout the year is one of the most effective ways of enhancing the study culture of our students at home.

As we know, the process of education is more important than mere results. Results, especially 100% results, are only a sign of the hardwork put into the long, winding journey of education. What we need to focus on is the process, not just results. Some of our students will invariably be slow. Instead of making haste to get good results, we should not put undue pressure on the children to yield quick and better results instantly. But allow them to progress towards contributing more and more. As Abraham Lincoln said, "I walk slowly but I never walk backward". Let us focus on the process, and results will follow. We need to combat the unprecedented emphasis on tests, exams and performance in education today.


In the classroom, focus on the process can yield several benefits for students, including fostering a growth mindset, creating a student-centred environment, and reducing stress for students. Test scores and examination marks may not accurately reflect a learner's success or failure, though parents and students spend enormous amounts of time, energy, and money chasing high marks because they believe these things are true indicators of learning. It is possible that students and teachers aiming for better grades and marks could lose sight of the learning process and their own growth and development.

As effective leaders, we need to see the value in process-focused teaching and learning, rather than on results-oriented enterprise. Focus on the process will lead to mastery, growth, and ultimately, better performance and better results. In this context, we need to also think about paying individual attention to students, especially the weaker ones. Most of the students need personal attention and encouragement. Even the above-average students need a lot of personal follow up. How much more do the weaker students need attention!

I could do some more of soul searching, but I would like to stop here by appealing to the communities, particularly those who are in the school, that this year, the province must see a good performance and ever better performance of our educational institutions. Finally, I say that the more the Principals spend their time in the school, with the teachers and pupils, the better the school and all in it will become. Don Bosco always spoke about our presence and that too, educative presence.

STRENNA 2020

Our Rector Major, Rev. Fr Ángel Fernández Artime SDB, as it is customary, has given the Salesian Family the following Strenna for the New Year 2020, which contains the words both of Our Lord and of our Founder Don Bosco: "Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Mt 6:10): **GOOD CHRISTIANS AND UPRIGHT CITIZENS**. The Rector Major says, "I would like the Strenna to continue to help us to have a central thread in the pastoral guidance of the New Year in every part of the world." In the context of a growing fragility, and sometimes inability, in being apostles and missionaries of the youth, and the precarious Indian situation where our identity is being questioned, the Strenna 2020 of our Rector Major has much to offer. Even as we keep discovering the richness of this Strenna, may we pay greater attention to educating our young people to a strong sense of citizenship, social justice and evangelical values.



BUDGET PREPARATIONS

As we do every year, each community will prepare the budget of the year for their community. Fr Economer will soon send out to the communities short directives on what, how, when and who should prepare the budget. The local economer is to initiate it in close consultation with the Rector or Leader of the community. He should know or elicit information from the community members what the community would like to do this year. He needs to circulate the draft in advance and in the community meeting, get the approval of all to his proposal. Finally, it should be the house council which should take the final decision and all the members need to sign it before it is brought to the Provincial team. All these and much more information and guidance, the Provincial Economer would send to the communities.

I would like to request the communites to take the Budget preparation seriously and follow all the norms and guidelines that the Provincial Economer will send.

John Moolachira, Archbishop of Guwahati, was the main celebrant of the Holy Eucharist in which 20 priests and thousands of Catholic faithful along with religious and other well-wishers attended the Holy Mass.

For the complete Tiwa Bible, special credit goes to Rev. Fr UV Jose SDB, former Parish Priest of Umswai. Under his able leadership, more than ten local church leaders did the translation work for the past five years. In this first edition, 2000 copies of the new complete Tiwa Bible (Old Testament & New Testament) were printed. It will be available for the faithful at the cost of Rs. 200/- per copy. During the releasing ceremony, four Protestant Tiwa Pastors were also given the newly released Tiwa Bible. The Tiwa Bible will also be a great asset for Tiwa Literature. It is also a great contribution of the Catholic Church to the Tiwa tribe.
