# **GENERAL CHAPTER 28**

The 28th General Chapter of the Salesians which started at Valdocco in Turin from 16th February 2020 was brought to a closure midway on 13th March 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic after completing all the essential requirements of a chapter.

As many as 242 delegates of 66 nationalities and representing the seven regions spread over more than 130 countries participated in the meet. The chapter was originally scheduled to end on April 4, 2020.

The theme of the chapter is "What kind of Salesians for the young people of today?" The Rector Major began the chapter with several words of thanks to the many guests, Salesians and representatives of the groups

of the Salesian Family. Fr Angel said that the first focus is that of a prophetic and hopeful gaze for an especially significant commitment: "responsibly guiding and animating a charism of the Church, for the Church and for the world, aroused by the Spirit."

The Rector major echoed the words of Fr Luigi Ricceri in General Chapter 20: 'Ours is not an assembly of shareholders of an industry, it is not a political assembly with factions with conflicting interests that are economic, prestige and ambition. We are here as Church - better, an assembly of consecrated men, gathered in the name of the Lord, totally devoted to a supernatural ideal?



General Chapter 28 is a great summons "to discern with realism, courage and determination, the orientation of the path to embark upon in this 21st century, in a very special ecclesial moment of renewal and purification."

What is the profile of the Salesian today? The one that has Don Bosco as a model. With Don Bosco as a model, saying Salesian today should be the same as saying:

- consecrated man of deep faith;
- apostolic passion for young people;
- son of God who knows he is and feels like a father to young people;
- charismatic identity of everyone who enriches the Church with the

- charism of Don Bosco and creates ecclesial communion:
- always faithful apostle of young 0 people, always flexible and creative;
- always educator, always friend of young people."

For the Province of Guwahati, it was a moment of great joy and jubilation after it received the news of the election of Fr (Dr) Biju Michael Pulianmackal as Regional Councillor for South Asia. Father Biju Michael succeeds Father Maria Arokiam Kanaga of Chennai Province, who served in the same post two terms.

# **RECTOR MAJOR RE-ELECTED**



Th e 28 t h General Chapter of the Salesian Congregation has re-elected Fr Ángel Fernández Artime as Rector Major for a second

term, from 2020- 2026. The election was decided at the first round of voting.

Fr Ángel Fernández Artime, 59, was born on 21 August 1960 in Gozón - Luanco, Asturias, Spain; he made his first profession on 3 September 1978, his perpetual vows on 17 June 1984 in Santiago de Compostela, and was ordained priest on 4 July 1987 in León.

Originally from León Province, he has been Youth Ministry Delegate, Rector of the school at Ourense, member of the Council and Vice Provincial and, from 2000 to 2006. Provincial of León.

He has a Doctorate in Pastoral Theology and a Licence in Philosophy and Pedagogy.


He was a member of the technical commission that prepared the General Chapter 26. In 2009, he was appointed Provincial of South Argentina, and thanks to this position he also got to know and collaborate personally with the then Archbishop of Buenos Aires, card. Jorge Mario Bergoglio, today Pope Francis.

On 23 December 2013, he was appointed Provincial of the new province of Mary Help of Christians in Spain, an office he couldn't take on, since the 27th General Chapter had elected him as tenth Successor of Don Bosco. It was 25 March 2014.

## Stefano Martoglio **ELÉCTED VIČAR**

The 28th General Chapter of the Salesian Congregation has elected Fr Stefano Martoglio as Vicar of the Rector Major for 2020-2026. Before his election, he was the Councillor for the Mediterranean region.

Stefano Martoglio was born in Turin on 30 November 1965. He entered the novitiate at Monte Oliveto in



Pinerolo in 1984, made his first profession in the Basilica of Mary Help of Christians in Turin on 8 September 1985, and his perpetual profession on 27 September 1992 in Castelnuovo Don Bosco. He was ordained priest in Turin on 11 June 1994.

He served as a member of the House Council in the community of Pinerolo and that of St. Dominic Savio, Valdocco, before becoming Rector of the Mother House of the Congregation in Valdocco in 2004. In 2008 he was appointed Superior of the Special Circumscription of Piedmont and Valle d'Aosta.

He participated in the 25th General Chapter and was part of the pre-chapter Commission for GC27. The 27th General Chapter elected him as the 1st Councillor for the Mediterranean region.

## GENERAL COUNCIL APPOINTED



28th General Chapter of the Salesian Congregation has elected the General Councillors for Formation, Youth Ministry, Social Communication and Missions for the 2020- 2026 term. The Economer General of the Congregation was also appointed on 12th march 2020.



In Formation, Fr Ivo Coelho (India) was confirmed for a second six-year term, as he held the same office in 2014-

2020. Fr Ivo Nicholas Coelho was born on 15 October 1958 in Mumbai (India). Entering the Salesian novitiate in Yercaud in 1976, he made his first vows on 24 May 1977 in the same city, and his perpetual vows exactly 7 years later in Mumbai. He was ordained a priest on 27 December 1987 in

Panjim. Among the most important previous positions, he was Provincial of India-Mumbai (2002-2008) and moderator at General Chapter 26.



Fr Miguel Angel García Morcuende (Spain) was elected as Councilor for Youth Ministry, having served in the

same Department between 2010 and 2017, involved in the School and Vocational Training Sector. Fr García Morcuende was born on 29 September 1967 in Madrid (Spain); he attended the Salesian novitiate in Mohernando, where he made his first profession on 16 August 1986. He made his perpetual vows in Arevalo on 11 June 1994, and was ordained a priest on 5 April 1997 in Madrid. Before his period of service in Rome he had already served in Youth Ministry at his home Province (2003-2010), the then "Spain-Madrid".



Elected to Social Communication was Fr Gildásio Mendes dos Santos (Brazil), this past February

installed as Provincial of the Salesian Province of Brazil-Belo Horizonte (BBH), and previously Provincial of Brazil-Campo Grande (BCG). Born on 18 March 1963 in Conceição do Barra, Fr Gildásio Mendes dos Santos entered the Salesian novitiate in São Carlos, where he made his first vows on 6 January 1984. He made his perpetual profession on 11 February 1990 in Campo Grande. On December 12, two years later, in Rondonopolis, he received priestly ordination. He gained his experience in the sector as Provincial Delegate for Social Communication (2004-2005 and then 2009-2015) in the BCG Province.



For Salesian Missions, Fr Alfred Maravilla, (Philippines) currently Superior of the Vice Province

of Papua New Guinea-Solomon Islands (PGS) was elected. Alfred Maravilla was born in Silay City, Negros Occidental, Philippines, on 31 July 1962. After completing his novitiate in Canlubang, he left as a missionary to Papua New Guinea, where he made perpetual vows on 24 March 1988 in Gabutu. After studying Theology in Cremisan, Israel, he received priestly ordination in his hometown on August 15, 1992. For him too it is a return to a Department where he had already collaborated: from 2008 to 2017, he was in Rome, working with the formation and accompaniment of missionaries.



Finally, reconfirmed as Economer General was Bro Jean Paul Muller, (Luxembourg) Salesian

coadjutor, who first served in this office on 27 January 2011 when he was appointed by the then Rector Major, Fr Pascual Chávez, and confirmed Economer by the 27th General Chapter. Born on October 13, 1957, in Grevenmacher, Luxembourg, he entered the novitiate in Jünkerath on August 16, 1978, where he made his first Salesian profession on August 15 of the following

year, and made his perpetual profession on August 15, 1984. He participated in General Chapters 23, 24 and 26 and was part of the pre-capitular commission for the Gc27.

**REGIONAL COUNCILLORS** 

The Capitulars of the 28th General Chapter of the Salesian Congregation elected Fr (Dr) Biju Michael Pulianmackal of the Province of Guwahati as the New Regional for South Asia. Fr. Biju Michael was born on 19th March 1970 at Moolamattam in Kerala, India. He was ordained a priest on January 5, 1999. He holds a doctorate in Moral Theology and Masters in English and in Bioethics. Until now he was holding the post of Registrar at Assam Don Bosco University and was a Councilor of the Province. He was the President of the Jerusalem Campus (Ratisbonne) of the Salesian Pontifical University. He is an internationally published author. His books include: Integrity the Core of Leadership (Oklahoma, USA), Educating Leaders for Social Transformation (ed) (Munich, Germany, Jesus' Ways to Success (New York, USA), Youth Vision (ed.) (Guwahati, India), Virtues (Jerusalem), Mary of Nazareth: Through Poems and Pictures from the Holy Land (Jerusalem, Israel).

The 28th General Chapter of the Salesian Congregation has also elected the seven new regional Councilors for the 2020-2026 sixyear term.



For the Africa-Madagascar region, Fr Alphonse Owoudou was elected, until now Superior of the Equatorial Tropical Africa Vice Province (ATE). Fr Owoudou was born in Ebolowa (Cameroon) on April 30, 1969; he carried out his novitiate in Lomé (Togo) between 1989 and 1990; he made his perpetual vows on 9 August 1997 in Yaoundé (Cameroon), where he was ordained a priest on 11 July 1999. He was Dean of the Post-Novitiate of Lomé (20112015) and Dean of the Salesian institute of Yaoundé. He obtained a Doctorate in Psychology from the Salesian Pontifical University (UPS) in Rome.



Elected for the America South Cone region was Fr Gabriel Romero, until now Provincial of North Argentina (ARN). Fr

Gabriel Romero was born on 10 September 1971 in San Miguel de Tucumán (Argentina). He attended the novitiate in La Plata, professing as a Salesian on January 31, 1991. His perpetual profession was made on 5 October 1996 and he received his priestly ordination in Cordoba on December 11, 1999. He is a professor of Philosophy and Educational Sciences, specializing in Youth Ministry. He also participated in the 27th General Chapter.



For the East Asia region, Fr Giuseppe Nguyen Thinh Phuoc, currently serving at the Mission Department, was

elected. Born on 2 November 1955 in Quang Ngai (Vietnam), he carried out his novitiate in Tram Hanh, concluded with his first profession on August 15, 1974. He made his perpetual vows in Dalat on 15 August 1980 and was ordained a priest on 9 September 1995 in Fountain Valley (USA). For his home Province, he was Councilor and Delegate for Formation.



For the Central and Northern Europe region, Fr Roman Jachimowicz was elected; until now he held the position

of Provincial of the Province of Poland-Piła (PLN). Fr Jachimowicz was born on 13 November 1967 in Gorzów Wlkp (Poland), carried out his novitiate in Swobnica, made his first profession on 22 August 1987 and perpetual profession on July 31, 1993, in Rumia; he was ordained a priest on 25 May 1995 in Lad. He was also Delegate for the Past Pupils for the "St. Adalbert" Province of Poland. He also speaks German and Russian.



For the Interamerica region, the new Councilor is Fr Hugo Orozco Sánchez, who until today was Provincial of

Mexico-Guadalajara. Born on June 30, 1968, in San Luis de Potosí (Mexico), he carried out his novitiate in Chula-Vista, made his first vows on 16 August 1989 in Tlaquepaque and perpetual ones on 10 September 1995, always in Tlaquepaque. He received priestly ordination in San Pedro de Tlaquepaque on 15 March 1997. Before being appointed Provincial, he had also served as Delegate for Youth Ministry and Formation for the MEG Province.



Finally, for the Mediterranean region, Fr Juan Carlos Pérez Godoy, outgoing Superior of the Salesian Province of Spain-St James Major (SSM) was chosen to replace Fr Stefano Martoglio, elected Vicar of the Rector Major. Fr Pérez Godoy was born on 5 November 1959 in Burguillos, made his first religious profession on September 8, 1978, perpetual profession on 15 August 1984 and was ordained a priest on June 5, 1987. Before serving the SSM Province, in the old Province of Seville, he was Delegate of Youth Ministry, Vicar, and Provincial, Graduated in Ecclesiastical Sciences, he has a Diploma in Magisterium and Catechetics and in Youth Ministry.

# 'DO DREAM ... AND MAKE OTHERS DREAM"

#### **Pope Francis**



In the message, sent to the Salesians on the occasion of the 28th General Chapter, Pope Francis displayed his intimate and profound knowledge of Don Bosco's charism. Speaking with familiarity, as if it were a simple "goodnight" in the oratory, he helped to identify the answer to the Chapter's question: "What Salesians for today's young people?" For the Argentine pontiff, the answer is: "the Salesian of the XXI century is a man full of hope because he knows that his center is in the Lord, able to make all things new."

After rejoicing at the fact that the General Chapter was taking place in Valdocco, he told the Salesians, "never to forget the youthful noise and the chattering of the Oratories", especially those who find themselves "like sheep without a shepherd", the Holy Father invites each Son of Don Bosco to "cultivate a contemplative attitude, able to identify and discern the crucial points," which then makes it able to show and open onto other dreams that this world fails to offer.

Taking Don Bosco as a model, the Pope indicated to the Salesians a religious model incapable of remaining neutral or inert in the face of events: a Salesian, we could say with

reference to the Strenna for 2020, who lives the policy of the Our Father, descended into reality to bring reality towards God. A Salesian neither clerical nor rigorist, but rather a consecrated person who does not choose to separate himself from the world to seek holiness, but allows himself be questioned, consulted, and chooses how and which world to live in.

Among the ideas he offered for the future journey of the Congregation, Pope Francis also underlined the gift of the female presence in Salesian works, from Mamma Margherita onwards: a presence capable of transmitting the dimension of hospitality, an affective - as well as effective - presence, and for this to be valued "as an actor who is not auxiliary, but rather constitutive of your presences."

Finally, the Pope Francis encouraged Salesians "to preserve the wealth of many of the cultures in which you are immersed without trying to 'standardize' them." On the contrary, "in this way the Salesian spirit,

far from getting lost in a uniformity of tones and nuances, will acquire a more beautiful and attractive expression It will be able to express itself in 'dialect'." And it will also be able to speak, with the same naturalness and authority, even in the languages of digital courtyards, in "the widespread 'pastoral of the screen."

The Pope's conclusion was almost a hymn to Don Bosco and his dreams for young people, and in particular those most in need: "Open homes that allows the Lord to manifest to many young people his unconditional love and allow you in return to enjoy the beauty to which you have been called. Do dream... And not just for yourselves and for the good of the Congregation, but for all young people without strength, deprived of the light and comfort of friendship with Jesus Christ, without a community of faith that sustains them, devoid of a horizon of meaning and life. Do dream ... and make others dream as well!"

# **VALDOCCO OPTION, OUR WAY FORWARD**

#### **Rector Major**

The Rector Major, Fr Ángel Fernández Artime concluded the 28<sup>th</sup> General Chapter with a parable from Holy Scripture, "What can I compare the kingdom of God to? It is similar to a bit of yeast: if a woman takes it

and kneads it with three large measures of flour, then the yeast ferments all the dough." This beautiful parable of Jesus can be a good comparison for General Chapter XXVIII. He said, "It was shorter than expected, but



like a pinch of yeast, its work has only just begun: it will spread its strength and beneficial ferments in and throughout the Congregation."

Pope Francis underlined in his message: "The Valdocco option of your 28th General Chapter is a good opportunity to regard the sources and ask the Lord: Da mihi animas, cetera tolle. This requires, on our part, to overcome the fears and apprehensions that may arise. Living faithfully the charism is something richer and more stimulating than simple abandonment, retreat or readjustment of the houses or activities; it involves a change of mentality in the face of the mission to be accomplished."

Nor can we forget the words of the young people present in the Chapter: "Salesians, do not forget us young people because we have not forgotten you and the charism that you have taught us! We want to express it wholeheartedly. Being here, we've made a dream come true. In this special place in Valdocco, where the Salesian mission began, which brings together Salesians and young people together. You have our hearts in your hands. You have to take care of your precious treasure. Please don't forget us and do keep listening to us."

Quoting Pope Francis, Fr. Artime said, "Salesianity is born precisely from this meeting capable of arousing prophecies and visions: welcoming, integrating and making the best qualities grow as a gift for others, especially for those marginalized and abandoned from whom nothing is expected."

In an atmosphere of true harmony, the Chapter demonstrated with empathy and coherence another truth underlined by the Pope: "The interlocutors of Don Bosco yesterday and of the Salesian today are not mere recipients of a strategy planned in advance, but live protagonists of the oratory to be built. Through them and with them, the Lord shows us His will and His dreams. We could call them co-founders of your houses."

The portrait of the Salesian for today's young people can be reflected in what the Rector Major affirms of himself: "I will try to be, as far as possible, a true man of God, with a strong charismatic and pastoral identity, farsighted, capable of one gaze of faith and hope

in reading reality. It is my deep desire to continue to be, as far as possible, a man capable of paternity and fraternal affection, of accompaniment, close to the confreres. I

# Pope Appoints **AUXILIARY BISHOP FOR TURA DIOCESE**



New Delhi, Feb 24, 2020: Pope Francis on February 24 appointed Father Jose Chirackal as the auxiliary bishop of Tura, a diocese in the northeastern Indian state of Meghalaya. The announcement was made at noon in Rome and its corresponding time (4:30 pm) in India. He will be consecrated as Bishop on 25th April 2020 at Sacred Heart Shrine, Tura.

The bishop-elect was born on July 14, 1960 at Ayiroor near Karukutty in Kerala's Ernakulam district. He was ordained a priest for Tura on December 29, 1987.

After the schooling in Kerala, he joined the Tura diocese in 1976. He studied at St. Paul's Minor Seminary, Philosophy at Christ King College, and Theology at Oriens Theological College, all in Shillong, the capital of Meghalaya state. 

# **BRO REACHES OUT TO THE POOR**







The Social Service wing of the Don Bosco Society, Guwahati Province, known as 'Bosco Reach Out' headquartered at Ulubari, Guwahati has been providing food and relief materials to 3500 poor daily wagers and migrant families who are suffering due to the 21-day lockdown after the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic. Currently Bosco Reach Out is distributing essentials kit which consists of Rice, Dal, Oil, Soya Nuggets, Soap, Hand Sanitizer and most important is Mask. We have planned to reach out 3500 families in Assam and Meghalaya. Till now we have provided immediate need of 263 families in urban slum of Guwahati city at Boothnath and Manipuri Basti.

The COVID-19 Crisis relief program for Boothnath and Manipuri Basti was organized on 31.3.2020 with the help of Assam Police. In Boothnath Slum a total of 172 families and in Manipuri Basti 91 families were found to be affected due to the COVID-19 lockdown. Most of the families are daily wage earners, servants, construction workers, daily labourers, Rickshaw-pullers, Balloon sellers, and so on, who have no means of income to feed their families for the next few weeks, due to lockdown. Bosco Reach Out gave them essential kit so they can sustain their family for 10 days.

Bosco Reach Out is grateful to the Assam Police personnel, volunteers and the staff of Bosco Reach Out, Guwahati for assisting

them to distribute the provisions at this critical time

# LECTED AS CRI PRESIDENT

of Guwahati Region

Fr. P.D. John SDB, Rector and Executive Director of Don Bosco Institute, Kharghuli was elected as CRI President of Guwahati Region and Sr. Catherine Kanampuzha FMA, Superior of Holy Child Convent was elected Secretary in the annual general body meeting held on 29th February 2020 at St. Joseph's Co-Cathedral Parish Hall, Panbazar.

Guwahati Region of CRI consists of the entire Archdiocese of Guwahati which is sub-divided into 4 zones - Guwahati, Goalpara, Nagaon and Kumarikatta.

Guwahati region has 75 different religious congregations rendering their service, out of which 27 belongs to men congregations and 48 to women congregations. Out of the 76 presences of various men congregations, 16 of them are belonging to the SDB's and out of the 116 presences of women congregations, MSMHC's have 14 centres and FMA's have 9 centres. Thus, the religious are rendering their services in 192 centres within the Archdiocese of Guwahati.

# Fr MILON NARJARY, SDB

Fr Milon Narjary SDB passed away on 4th January 2020 at Apollo Hospital, Guwahati. In spite of the best possible treatment given to him, he couldn't live his normal life after he suffered a stroke on 14th December 2017 at Gojapara when he was Parish Priest of Gojapara and incharge of the Centre. After

he was taken to Nirmala Hospital, Goalpara, he was rushed to Nemcare Hospital, Bhangagarh, Guwahati where he underwent a major surgery on his head to remove the blood clot, which involved a craniotomy, that is, the surgical removal of a part of the skull in order to remove the



clot. For a few weeks, he was in the ICU as he needed an extended critical care. Then he was shifted to the Sacred Heart Palliative Care Centre, 9th Mile, Guwahati, run by the Sacred Heart Sisters, where he was showing gradual improvement in his health. Though there was some amount of recovery, his memory was not proper. He could not remember much of the past.

Later, he had to undergo another surgery to replace the bone flap taken out from the skull and preserved in the abdomen. After this surgery, he was once again taken to Sacred Heart Palliative Care Centre for nursing care. After he had received sufficient nursing and medical attention, he was once again shifted to Provincial House for further care. He showed progress in health though it was very slow. He even joined the community for the Holy Mass and the Adoration regularly. Assisted by his attendant and his physiotherapist, he would do regular exercises in the verandah of the Provincial House.

Seeing his steady improvement, early last year he was taken to Kerala for a naturopathic treatment. It seemed to have helped him, though there was no visible sign of improvement with regard to his memory. On his return from Kerala, it was decided to take him closer to his home so that he could meet with his brothers and sisters and his dear ones. He was taken to Bengtol and then to Dotma. It was at Dotma that he had a fall.

and also contracted typhoid. His condition worsened ever since. No amount of medical treatment could help him, and the medical reports at this stage suggested that he was increasingly moving towards a vegetative state. But God called him to himself on January 4, 2020 at 11 pm to enter into the joy of the Master.

#### His Life and Vocation

Milon Narjary was born on 4th April 1965 to Late Mr Bovendra Narjary and Mrs Bonsri Narjary at Ladanguri, Assam, in the parish of Bengtol, in the Diocese of Bongaigaon. Milon was the second of the eight children: four brothers and four sisters. His father and one of his brother's had passed away two years ago.

Fr. Milon began his novitiate on 24th May 1984 in Sunnyside, Shillong and professed on 24th May 1985. After his profession, he was sent to Salesian College, Dimapur for his post novitiate formation and philosophical studies. He did his Practical Training in the parish of Barpeta for two years and in the Salesian novitiate of Sunnyside, Shillong for one year. He made his perpetual profession on 7th April 1991 in Shillong. The final phase of his theological training was at Sacred Heart Theological College, Shillong from 1991 to 1994. He was ordained a priest on 22nd January 1995. After his ordination, Fr Milon continued with his Masters in Theology, which he

completed in the year 1996. Later he also did a one-year formation and counselling course at NVSC, Pune (2007-2008).

#### Fr Milon's Ministry

There are two special features that characterised Fr Milon's religious and priestly ministry: one is formation work, and the other is pastoral-missionary work. Fr Milon was known as an effective and compassionate formator as well as a kind, people-centred pastor. He was Counsellor in the aspirantate at Bosco Mount, Tura during the year 1997-98 and was Rector in the same community between the years 2004 and 2007, and again from 2008 to 2013. Yet, the majority of his priestly and religious years were spent in the parishes and mission stations of Dotma, Damra and Gojapara. As a kind hearted pastor, he was close to the people he served.


As a religious, he was a community man, soft-spoken, humble and unassuming, regular for prayers and practices of piety. Lover of the Eucharist and of Mother Mary, he was a committed religious and priest. He avoided the limelight, but was there for others whenever needed. He connected to the simple and poor people easily. While he was sick, he would suddenly remember his boarding boys and ask me to take him back to Gojapara as he had to feed them, and buy provisions for them. He would remember

some others and weep suddenly. Even in his broken memories we could see him as a man for others, a man who wanted to keep his word, a man who was committed to his mission.

God has plucked a young and dynamic priest too soon for his heavenly abode. Fr Milon could have many more years of active service for the Lord as Salesian and pastor of the people. But God's plan is certainly better than our human plans for him. We have lost an endearing and sweet person in Fr Milon. God will continue to work in us through Fr Milon. His memory will live on in our hearts. His prayers and sacrifices, and especially his suffering will bless our apostolic efforts.

May our Blessed Mother Mary, Help of Christians lead his soul to Jesus and present him to God, our Father.





Bro. Aloysius Induar SDB passed away on 8 February 2020, at St. Augustine's Hospital, Bongaigaon. Though he had been ailing and bedridden for a few years, no one expected his sudden departure from this world.

In June last year, the Province celebrated the golden jubilee of Br. Aloysius in a very solemn way at his community, Barpeta Road, for which many confreres, religious and lay people, parishioners and well-wishers were present. Though Brother was weak and tired, he was very happy and cheerful. It was a celebration of the marvellous deeds worked by God in and through Br. Aloysius. It was also a celebration of Brother's commitment and dedication as Salesian. His satisfaction and contentment were clearly seen, also because his dear ones were around him for this special celebration.

#### His Life and Vocation.

Bro. Aloysius Induar was born on 1st January 1944, to Mrs. Philomena and Mr. Paulus Induar, at Baghmara village, in the diocese of Dibrugarh. He was the youngest of the four children, and the only son. His three elder sisters already passed away earlier.

After having joined the Salesians, he entered the novitiate at Sunnyside, Shillong on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 1968 and made his first profession as a Salesian Coadjutor Brother on 24th May 1969. He went on to embark religious life by totally surrendering to God through Perpetual Profession on 24<sup>th</sup> May 1975 at Sonada, Darjeeling. Before his perpetual he qualified himself in the field of technical studies at Calcutta (Kolkata). As a committed son and follower of Don Bosco, Br. Aloysius had dedicated his life to various missions and to a number of institutions in his more than 50 years of his service.

From 1969 to 1991, and from 2003 to 2004 Bro. Aloysius served at Don Bosco Technical School, Maligaon, Guwahati, where he had been teacher to so many youngsters, including our own confreres. It was here at Maligaon that Bro. Aloysius spent the longest time of his life and religious apostolate, that is, 23 years of his 50 years of religious life. He also spent considerable time at Tripura, pioneering the Salesian works in the state of Tripura. He served at the community of Mariam Nagar, Agartala, Tripura for four years: from 1991 to 1995, and at Bishramganj, Tripura for eight years: from 1995 to 2003. He also served as Warden in the community of Kumarikatta from 2004 to 2005. Then for two years he was at Snehalaya, Guwahati from 2005 to 2007 with the youth at risk, offering his love and expertise. There he was also incharge of the vocational training for the youngsters. Then he was appointed to the community of Doomni where he spent one year from 2007 to 2008, before he moved on to his last community of Barpeta. For 12 long years he was at Barpeta Road: from 2008 to 2020. He was incharge of the farm and other administrative activities before he became ill.

#### His Simplicity and Humility


What stands out from the life of Bro. Aloysius is his simplicity and humility. He never wanted to occupy big positions. He always wanted to play the second fiddle; he enjoyed being at backstage while at the same time encouraging so many confreres and youngsters in their education and offering

them training in various aspects. He was a silent worker. He lived his commitment like St. Joseph, silently but effectively.

#### His Cheerfulness

But whatever he did was done cheerfully, and with a lot of heart. His cheerful presence was one way of living his Salesian vocation and charism. His closeness to Don Bosco and his values were seen by his joyful optimism. Even during his moments of suffering, Bro. Aloysius tried his best to be cheerful and joyful. We thank him for this beautiful example. His simplicity, humility and cheerfulness will remain a legacy and in history a living spirit.

May God, the Merciful Father, grant Br. Aloysius an eternal place in His Kingdom, for whom he toiled and suffered. May many youngsters be inspired to follow Jesus as Br. Aloysius himself did.
